#### **Pastor's Reflection**

People of Peace,

"All Lives Are Precious." Those are the words etched in the rock memorial just blocks from Peace Lutheran Church. It's the message from God to all of us in Jesus. The memorial is part of walking tours we've been taking at Peace since it was erected in 1993. Neighborhood leader Larry Norman, member of Peace, helped spearhead the project at a difficult time in our history, when the Hilltop neighborhood was riddled with violence, drug traffic, and gang activity, as a way to lift up all lives that were lost. Recently it was rededicated, and there was a special celebration on May 23 to celebrate its 23<sup>rd</sup> anniversary at the corner of S. 23<sup>rd</sup> and Grant Street.



Psalm 23 is its guiding word from scripture, "Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, you are with me." (Catch the "23" theme?)

Diane Powers, member of Peace and Director of the City of Tacoma's Office of Equity and Human Rights, meets regularly with leaders of our Conversations Around Race. In our last meeting, she reminded us that the "Black Lives Matter" movement is not saying that that only black lives matter or that black lives matter more but that black lives matter, too.

All lives are precious. In our six week series on 2 Corinthians, Paul is helping us see that and think about the implications.

2 Corinthians 5:16-18: Paul writes, "From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation."

Paul urges us to see one another through the eyes of Jesus, from God's point of view (as children of God, brothers and sisters to one another), and to answer God's call to the ministry of reconciliation. Doing the ministry of reconciliation means sharing in word and action the good news of God in Jesus that reconciles people to God and people to one another across all kinds of differences and all sorts of humanly-created barriers.

One of the five points in the vision statement of Peace Lutheran Church is "reconciled"—"We believe God's vision for Peace is to be a diverse community of faith in the Hilltop where all are welcome - a community that is Spirit-filled, compassionate, healthy, **reconciled**, and just." We live into that vision together—we're not there yet, but we move toward it on God's power and by God's grace.

God bless you this summer, precious children of God, to be a blessing to others in this ministry of reconciliation to which we're called together!

#### **Vision and Call Fellows**

This year with Kids@Peace has been a huge blessing to me, and in a lot of ways I did not foresee at the beginning of my term. May 20th we concluded our final Kids@Peace meeting and after a year with these kiddos there are some major lessons I have learned along the way.

# First and foremost, kids NEED STRUCTURE!! Probably one of the things I witness the most with kids that I work with is this desire to do what they want when they want. They often get very frustrated with rule makers and are agitated at their lack of power when they are told what to do. Deep down though, I have discovered, kids are actually very thankful for well thought out parameters,

whether they voice it or not. Even the most



rebellious kids are comforted by knowing what to anticipate from a repetitive schedule and consistent authority figures. I will note, it is common to be able to find at least a few kids within each group that love following the rules and try their hardest to avoid trouble.

Secondly, kids want someone to look up to. Whether we know it or not, we all have a sense of influence and responsibility. Before anybody formally said it to me, I knew an element of this position was going to be inspiring kids and exposing them to realities they had never thought of before. And in a faith environment this is all the more powerful because we are given the opportunity to show kids how God can take any human and do spectacular and unpredictable things with them for his glory.

Lastly, when we treat our kids like responsible people they will act accordingly (most of the time).

Responsibility is an instrument and it needs to be wielded and handled respectively. I am a person that tends to try to accomplish all my tasks on my own, so I rarely ask for help. But I have quickly seen the power in letting youth help with simple tasks like carrying a basket for me, holding my notebook, or trusting them to retrieve something for me. These simple tasks that I don't really think much of, hold immense value in their minds. When we are able to trust kids in these ways it sends the message that they matter and are worthy of being trusted. In addition to the three I have mentioned, I have learned many more lessons than that. My year of being a Vision and Call has emphasized the importance of service from the beginning and running K@P has enabled me to serve and grow with the kids of this community. If we all can just take the time to remember what it was like to be a kid, that simple reflection can help us so much to serve kids more fully. When I remember the way I looked up to my cousins growing up and wanted to be just like them, that's very similar to the way these kids look up to us. Often times we are very critical of ourselves or our projects, but through eyes of a kid all they see are heroes and adults that deeply care about them.



Stewardship

Ja'Niyah Sample: "Honor your father and your mother, so that your days may be long in the land that the Lord your God is giving you." (Exodus 20:12) Ja'Niyah chose this verse because it's important to be thankful to have parents and to treat our parents well because they gave birth to us. Ja'Niyah serves God by caring about people, helping at the local community center, and helping out her family. Her dream job is to have a business to help people who are homeless get their lives back on track.

Josiah Anderson: "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside still waters; he restores my soul. He leads me in right paths for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff—they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord my whole life long." (Psalm 23) This passage tells Josiah that God is always there, cares about him, and will protect him from bad times. Josiah serves God by taking care of children, playing cello, and fixing stuff for people. His dream job is to be an engineer for Compass Bicycles.

Brianna Miller: "We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose." (Romans 8:28) This verse reminds Brianna that if she's going through a struggle, God will be there and is working to bring good out of something bad. She serves God by baking for others, taking care of children, making people feel good, showing compassion, and helping out in worship at Peace. Brianna's dream job is to be an actor or singer or nurse or bakery owner.

#### From the Church Council

Dear People of Peace,

Your Church Council continues to work hard to the glory of God and to do His will where we are planted, in the beautiful Hilltop of Tacoma. We all have different tasks and job duties, but we work as a whole. We now have a new Council member! Barbara Hartness agreed to serve as Treasurer – thank you, Barbara, for saying 'yes' and thanks to Tim Chalberg for his good and faithful service as Treasurer for his extended term.



Not only do we work to make Peace the light is it, we partner with other groups and causes. We formed a partnership with HUG (Hilltop Urban Gardens) where they would expand their gardens from the corner of 19<sup>th</sup> & Ainsworth to our corner of 21<sup>st</sup> & Ainsworth. You may have noticed the beginning of garden spots on the parking strips on the side of Peace's homes! HUG also hopes to erect a greenhouse/training space where the old garage is behind the two Peace homes. What a fruitful (and veggie-full) partnership!

Another way Peace is extending beyond our walls is through a voter registration emphasis, shepherded by Sally Perkins. She is getting the word out that Peace is a place where people can register to vote or get more information. There is an emphasis on helping people with prior felony convictions get registered to vote. In 2009 a law was passed making it easier for them to get their voting right back, but many do not know this law was passed.

Council recently approved a long term lease with the Community Center. This will make it easier for the Center to apply for, and qualify for, grants as they enter into a capital campaign. This shows a strong partnership between Peace Lutheran Church and Peace Community Center.

If you ever want to know more about the Council, you can read Council minutes and reports (in the church office) or ask any of us. And don't be surprised if someone taps you on the shoulder and says "would you be willing to serve on church council?" God's Work. Our Hands.
