"For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return there until they have watered the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and succeed in the thing for which I sent it." -- Isaiah 55:10-11

People of Peace,

For her internship, Pastor Louise Buckles and I have been reading and discussing a book called *Holy Currencies: 6 Blessings for Sustainable Missional Ministries*, by Eric Law. Eric

Law is a leader in training for cultural competency and developing leaders in multicultural faith communities. He led a training at Peace several years ago. He's helped me think of stewardship, our calling to be good managers of all the gifts God has entrusted us, in new ways. Using Isaiah 55, he talks about the Cycle of Blessings—how everything is God's, God gives abundantly, and as children of God we don't keep God's gifts but circulate them, and as we do God's blessings are recycled to create more blessings! I like that image of blessings, like water, flowing and overflowing. That's been my experience in life and at Peace Lutheran Church! As people freely share what God has given us, we see God bringing more and more blessings to our community!

Eric Law shares another helpful image in his book. We often talk of money as a currency. Do we think of it, though, like water (like a current flowing)? Money can only be effective in mission if it's moving and flowing—if it's being used for God's work. Eric Law shares five other currencies that must all be moving and flowing for faith communities to be vibrant and missional: the currency of relationship, of truth, of wellness, of time and place, and of gracious leadership. He says, "The Cycle of Blessings is the dynamic exchanges of these six currencies, flowing inward to renew and strengthen internal relationships and increase gracious leadership capacity, and flowing outward to connect, discern the truth, and foster wellness in the wider community."

This Fall, we will have the opportunity at Peace to explore on four Sundays some of these currencies. How are they flowing in our lives, in our church, in our community? The Fall theme will be "God's Gifts—Handle with Care," and on four Sundays—September 30 through October 21—we will look at money, relationships, God's creation, and time. Sunday October 21 is our annual Commitment Sunday, and each of us will have the opportunity in worship to bring our pledge of time, talent, and treasure to God for God to use in 2019. This is our way of offering ourselves as conduits, as vessels, for God's blessings to flow through us to others and to God's world.

Praise God from whom all blessings flow! God's blessings to you and your family as we enter Fall with many opportunities to grow in faith and serve God at Peace!


Hilltop Book Drive: Have any gently used or new books you're willing to donate? We are collecting books for Hilltop families through the end of September. Please bring items to the church office.

Our young people spent time loving and serving hurting people who desperately needed to know the hope that is found only in Christ. We taught

in a children's shelter, stocked food at the local food bank and served meals to people experiencing homelessness. I believe this experience changed the lives of our young people.

We said "see you later" to Ariah Phillips and Juwan Banks as they completed their term of service as Vision and Call interns. Somehow we survived Summer Bible Adventure with moving everything up a month and holding it only one day. Charissa Carroll and Jeanie Correa did an amazing job at bringing it all together. It has been a great summer working side by side with Peace Community Center staff and Peace Church staff and volunteers.

As the 2018-2019 school year starts, there are some new staff people, new programs and new opportunities for all of us to use our God given gifts to serve the children, youth and families of Peace. We welcome Jae Bates as our new Vision and Call Intern. Jae will be supporting volunteer leaders for the many youth and children's ministry offerings we have at Peace, he will also be lending his gifts to the McCarver Scholars after school program. As you see Jae, welcome him and ask how you may be of support in his new role here at Peace.

Dear Friends of Peace,

Peace Community Center has had a busy summer with our Summer Academy programs, continuing to move through staffing transitions, and working on the building construction. Now, we're also preparing for the new school year and welcoming our new Service Team members.



During the summer, 200+ students participated in Summer Academy in our elementary, middle school, and high school programs. Students spent the summer in reading and math classes; building community together; and trying out new experiences like high ropes courses, dance, and theater. Our staff poured into students for two weeks with the high school students, four weeks with middle schoolers, and six weeks with elementary school students. It was rewarding!



This summer we also said good-bye to several staff members, and we want to take a moment to thank them for their incredible work these past several years. After being in our programs for the past three years, both Keith Blocker (our Middle School Director) and Arlicia Etienne (our High School Coordinator) are moving on from the Center. Additionally, Alyssa Urish is moving on after leading our elementary program for the last five school years. All three will be missed by staff and students. Please join us in wishing Keith, Arlicia, and Alyssa well on their next steps.

If you've been around Peace, you've also probably noticed that renovations have started on the facility. The expanded footprint is underway and very soon we will be taking off the roof, tearing into walls, and starting on updates to areas like the bathrooms and the kitchen. We are excited to be at this point and ask for your continued prayers and support during this phase of the project. We are still trying to raise \$100,000 to finish raising our \$2.6 million goal. Right now, all gifts to the campaign are being matched dollar-for-dollar, and we hope to finish fundraising by mid-fall. Thank you for all the efforts of the Peace Lutheran Church community to help bring this project to this point! We are blessed!

Greetings,

The summer was a wonderful time for reflection and consideration of the upcoming fall and winter calendar. With the gospel choir only rehearsing twice a month, new music continued with transcendent singings of 'He Shall feed His flock', by James Cleveland and 'Bread of Heaven' by Fred Hammond. 'Bread of Heaven', sung in many ways throughout the month of August during 5 weeks of 'Jesus is the Bread of Life' in scripture, sermon and song.

On Thursday August 16 the Church staff met for a day retreat at St Marks Lutheran Church. We were able to share our 2018-2019 vision.

Within the Worship Committee, there is a music component to be developed this year to discuss ways to enhance Music Ministry activities, and fulfill ministry goals. Inclusive music planning, for example, is of particular importance leading to the idea of providing a 'music suggestion box', that anyone could submit a song for Gospel choir or Sunday service. After review and consideration, songs could be a part of Worship. It is encouraged that children attend each Sunday morning to experience this unique worship time.

There is always so much to do at Peace. I was feeling a little discouraged by the things I, or we, have not finished, or have not started. I then thought of the things we have worked on and/or accomplished and now I feel much better.

FINANCE

The council has studied the suggestions of the ad hoc Finance Committee. We met with ourselves and with bankers and studied options. We have implemented most of the committee's ideas. The goal is to make reporting to you easier and to be able to see what resources we have available. By the time you read this we will have held a forum to show you the results.

INTERNSHIP

We discussed and prayed about accepting an Intern Pastor and now Pastor Louise is here with us and we look forward to sharing our ministry with her. We have formed a committee to support her in her internship.

COMMUNITY RESOURCE MINISTRY

We have received a grant from the synod and now have Teri Jelinek as our Community Resource Coordinator. A major part of this ministry is our community meals program so Teri will have challenges immediately planning for the program during the remodel project. Our goal is to have one meal a week all year in addition to the April and October program we currently have. Beyond food we hope to have social services people at the weekly meals.

BUSINESS LICENSE AND NEW NAME

The state decided that there can't be two Peace Lutheran Churches so we are now Peace Lutheran Church of Tacoma, at least on our license.

Congregational Meeting on Sunday September 23 at 10 am This meeting will focus on the Peace Community Center. We will vote on the new Center board, hear Center updates, and meet and learn more about Center staff. Please attend. We must have a quorum of voting members to vote.

Great News! We received word that Peace Lutheran Church and Pastor John have been awarded the sabbatical grant (through the Lilly Endowment Clergy Renewal Program) we applied for a few months ago! This provides money for Pastor John and family to go on a three-month sabbatical next summer and for Peace to cover expenses in his absence and do a meaningful sabbatical learning program of our own! Praise God!

Facility Renovation Update We are now feeling the impact of the renovation of our facility on our programs and ministries. The entire project is slated to be completed by the end of this year, December 2018. The first floor restrooms adjoining the multipurpose room will be out of commission until the end of December. On Sundays please use the restrooms in the basement or across the alley in the new classroom. Very soon the kitchen will be under renovation and will not be able to be used for several months.

Please be patient and flexible in this time of disruption for several months on the way to a new kitchen, renovated restrooms, spruced up multipurpose room, and new office wing, among other improvements. When the renovation is complete, we will have a wonderful tool for God's mission together!
