Pastor's Reflection

People of Peace,

"But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us." -- Ephesians 2:13-14

Tragically, in our nation, we have countless reminders of our human sin and hostility toward one another. The horrific racially motivated shooting at the Tops grocery store in Buffalo is another—hatred of the other spills out in violence as people are targeted for their skin color, deemed unworthy of living. Of

13 people shot, 11 were Black, 10 died. Human sin and hostility are not just found in racist individuals who carry out brutal acts; human sin and hostility are present in racism found in systems and institutions in our nation that hold back and hold down people of color and destroy our communities. We need the peace of Jesus. The church has been silent and complicit for too long; we need to take a lead role in seeking racial justice and peacemaking. We're called to live as Jesus' peacemakers in our world.

Peace Lutheran Church has a foundational commitment to anti-racism. Our Future Directions help us live into this commitment, and we're on the journey. Our recent Lent Season of Prayer helped us experience God's presence and guidance as we work to understand, address, and dismantle racism. We're making plans to expand our housing ministry by building a two-bedroom DADU (detached accessory dwelling unit) in the backyard of one of our properties. Providing affordable housing in our gentrifying neighborhood combats ongoing displacement of families of color, a racial justice issue. We had a rite of retiring the white European-depicted Jesus statue as we examine symbols in our worship space and what they communicate. We're leaving that space vacant for awhile as we open ourselves to reimagine it in the direction of God's abundant welcome for all. We hosted a powerful Healing Racism gathering with Rev. Dr. Gregory Drumwright, nationally recognized educator and advocate for equity, higher education, access and social justice. At the gathering Bishop Gwendolyn Coates shared how our hearts are often filled with hatred, selfishness, and racism. She called us to make room in our hearts for love, acceptance, and welcome for all. And she suggested, the vacant space in our sanctuary helps Peace Lutheran Church make room for what God is doing next in our midst. Our symbols hold meaning and power. Our actions speak volumes to the community.

The power of racism is great in our society, but the power of the gospel of Jesus is greater. Amen? Living into our commitment to anti-racism is about following Jesus' call to love our neighbors. It's our response to the gospel. It's what God is calling us to do in our context. It's our ministry of place. How will you lean in to this commitment? How will you make room in your heart? We're learning, growing, serving, and acting together.

Housing Ministry

We can't hear the hammers or saws yet, but there is quite a lot of activity going on related to Peace's housing program. For a couple years now the Housing Program Team (Brendan Nelson, Carmean Lampman, Alan Kies, Alan Shelton, Bill Hanawalt, Craig Cogger, Pastor John, and Chris Ferguson) has been looking at possibilities for construction of one or more detached accessory dwelling units (DADUs, also known as backyard cottages) on one of our housing program properties. With Council's support, we have now moved into pre-construction planning with DADU Homes, looking to build a two-bedroom



DADU on the alley end of our Cushman house property. In a few weeks we expect to have a building and financial plan that can be presented to the congregation for approval.

Meanwhile, Peace has joined a cadre of six churches in our synod in a Faith Land Stewardship cohort meeting monthly now through the end of the year as we look to the future of our housing ministry. Here is the question for this discernment process: We are in the midst of a profound housing affordability crisis, an ecological crisis, and we are emerging from the biggest health, social and economic crises in a generation. In this pivotal moment, in each of our contexts, what does it mean to steward faith land toward Shalom (love, healing, and justice at every level of life)?

God is leading us as we lean into our calling into our ministry of place in the Hilltop as part of our **Future Directions!**
