DONATE: Tacoma Mutual Aid is asking for donations for those impacted by the flooding in the area, and for our houseless neighbors (especially in preparation for the first freeze of the winter).

They are looking for tents, tarps, weatherproof shoes, sleeping bags, hand and foot warmers, 1lb propane tanks, lanterns and headlamps, and waterproof bags. Please drop off at King's Books during their regular business hours.

NEED TO KNOW & TAKE ACTION: "The House of Representatives just passed a bill that would subject immigrant children to invasive bodily searches and keep them in detention instead of releasing them to their families." (ACLU)

H.R. 4371, also known as the "Kayla Hamilton Act," passed on Dec. 16 and has now moved to the Senate for a vote. This bill was presented as an anti-trafficking bill that claims safety for all. However, the bill will physically, emotionally and psychologically endanger unaccompanied immigrant children. Call on our senators and make sure they do not allow this bill to continue! NEED TO KNOW & TAKE ACTION: On Dec. 17, the House of Representatives has passed H.R. 3492 "Protect Children's Innocence Act," which bans gender-affirming care, criminalizing trans youth accessing gender affirming care and medical professionals offering life-saving care. The bill is riddled with transphobia and inaccurate and misleading data under the guise of protecting youth.
