ENGAGE & LEARN: The 2026 legislative session has already introduced both problematic and promising initiatives and bills. NEED TO KNOW: The far-right political group Let’s Go Washington has shared that they have garnered enough signatures for two anti-trans initiatives to be placed on the ballot. The first (IL26-638) would place a transgender sports ban for high school students with genital inspections as the primary verification method. The second (IL26-001) would mandate the forced outing of trans students statewide.

What happens now? After the signatures are certified, WA State Legislators can either pass the initiatives as written, reject the initiatives, or propose an alternative initiative.

What can we do? Contact your legislators and demand better for our trans youth! You can find your legislative and congressional district using this WEBSITE, click on the names of each person to find their contact information. Protect trans youth!
