01 **COMMUNITY SHARING:** The Hilltop Urban Garden (HUG) is hosting HUG Grub from April through November 2026. HUG Grub is a community-powered food distribution rooted in food sovereignty, dignity, and care. You can visit HUG Grub at 1512 S 19th St every 1st and 3rd Saturday of the month, but please take a look at the attached flyer to learn about specific times for participating.

02 **CELEBRATE:** Celebrate and honor Juneteenth on **Friday, June 19 from 12pm - 6pm** at the Haub Family Field at Lemay Car Museum (right across from the Tacoma Dome). Juneteenth commemorates the end of slavery, when the final enforcement of the Emancipation Proclamation was ordered in Texas – over two years after the Emancipation Proclamation was signed.



This “Juneteenth Celebration: A Road to Economic Freedom” event will be a day filled with music, joy, local vendors, performances, and so much more. To learn more, follow their Facebook page via the QR code.

03 **TAKE ACTION:** With the World Cup upon us, join local activists and organizers on **Friday, June 19 at 9am at Ruby Chow Park** (6265 Stanley Ave. S, Seattle) in calling for ICE to stay out of our communities and the World Cup. This administration has confirmed ICE presence during the six anticipated matches happening at Lumen Field this summer. While being touted as important security measures, we know that this is an alarming over-policing of an event that garners an international audience, by an agency with a track record of inhumane and violent practices.
